## Two Ways Molloy Students Can Earn College Credit

Molloy students can earn college credit while still in high school by taking **Advanced Placement Examinations** offered by the College Board. These include English Literature, English Composition, Calculus, Global History, American History, Psychology, Spanish and Biology.

The **St. John's University/Seton Hall Extension Program** at Molloy enables qualified students to earn college credit and placement while still in high school by providing college-level courses with credit accepted at many other colleges and universities. Current offerings in this program include Johannine Literature, English Literature, Introduction to Calculus, Constitutional Law, Psychology, Government, French, Italian, Spanish and Physics.

## Course of Studies

The curriculum is focused on math, science and the humanities and delivers a well-rounded educational experience. Ninth graders typically are enrolled in Religion, English, Algebra, Global History, Biology, Foreign Language, Music, Computer Applications and Physical Education. Advanced standing is granted to qualified students, placing them in Geometry or the second year of a language. French, Italian and Spanish are offered. All students follow a curriculum that leads to a Regents-level diploma. More than 40% of the freshmen class is placed in a special Honors Program.

## Facilities

Our six-acre campus includes the main building, constructed in 1957, and the DeChiaro Center for Arts & Sciences, constructed in 1987. The school has three science laboratories, a music room, art studio, library, chapel, cafeteria, theater and guidance complex. # Driving Directions

**GRAND CENTRAL WESTBOUND**—Exit 17 - 168 Street. At the fourth light on the service road, go left onto Main Street. Bear right at the flashing light.

**GRAND CENTRAL EASTBOUND**—Exit 14 - Union Turnpike. Go right onto Main Street. Bear right at the flashing light.

**VAN WYCK SOUTHBOUND**—Exit 11 - Jewel Avenue. Make a left onto Jewel, go six blocks to Main Street. Go right onto Main Street, proceed 1.7 miles. Bear right at the flashing light.

**VAN WYCK NORTHBOUND**—Exit 9 - Queens Boulevard. Go right at the first light onto Hoover Avenue. Go five blocks on Hoover Avenue to Main Street. Make a right turn onto Main Street. Bear right at the flashing light.
